OVERVIEW

- > AAT Level 3 or A-Levels at grades A*/A/B or significant work experience is required for entry
- > Studied on a part-time basis, either one day per week or over two evenings
- > 6 hours per week in class sessions and remote learning
- Assessment involves a selection of computer based assessments, ranging from 2 to 3 hours in length

As part of the course you will study a range of units including:

- Financial Statements of Limited Companies
- Professional Diploma Synoptic Assessment

- > This course is based on learning and applying theory within a set exam.

 Knowledge and skills are tested via computer based assessments, run entirely on PCs or laptops.
- > To achieve competency, each exam requires a 70% pass rate.
- > Successful completion of the qualification may allow you to apply for full AAT membership to achieve professional MATT status.
